### ANDREW J. PLANTINGA (University of California Santa Barbara)



Andrew J. Plantinga is Professor in the Bren School of Environmental Science and Management at the University of California, Santa Barbara. He completed a Ph.D. in Agricultural and Resource Economics at the University of California-Berkeley. His current research focuses on the economics of land use, climate change, and forests. Particular emphasis is given to the development of methods for econometrically modeling land-use decisions, the analysis of environmental policies that affect private land-use decisions, and the modeling of land development pressures. ## AFSE PhD Awards



**Mathias REYNAERT** is an Assistant Professor of Economics at the Toulouse School of Economics, University of Toulouse I Capitole, and a research affiliate at the Center for Economic Policy Research (CEPR). Mathias obtained his Ph.D. in economics in 2015 from the KU Leuven and the University of Antwerp. He visited MIT CEEPR in 2019 during a sabbatical year and has also done shorter research visits at the University of California at Berkeley, Wharton at the University of Pennsylvania, and the University of Chicago. In 2018, he received an ANR JJC grant; in 2021, he received the prize for young researchers in Green Finance from the Banque de France. At TSE, Mathias teaches empirical industrial organization, environmental economics, and applied econometrics courses. The main focus of Mathias' published research is the implementation of environmental policy in the European Automobile Market. The 2022 Review of Economic Studies article 'Abatement Strategies and the Cost of Environmental Regulation: Emission Standards on the European Car Market' uses a structural econometric demand and supply model to understand strategic industry responses to environmental regulation. The article studies how automakers resorted to gaming because of regulatory design (the standard is attribute-based) and a lack of enforcement. The research shows that understanding both the political and practical implementation of emission standards in combination with strategic responses is crucial to evaluating regulation's welfare consequences.



**Stéphane BENVENISTE** holds a PhD in economics from Aix-Marseille University. Connecting economics and sociology, his doctoral dissertation was supervised by Alain Trannoy and is entitled "*Grandes Écoles* in the 20th century, the field of the French elites: social reproduction, dynasties, networks". He is an associate faculty at the Aix-Marseille School of Economics and spent two years at the Economics Department of Sciences Po as a temporary lecturer. He will join the French Institute for Demographic Studies (Ined) in September 2022 as a postdoctoral fellow. His research topics include the economics of inequality, education, intergenerational mobility and socio-economic history. For his PhD thesis, he collected historical registers of graduates from fifteen of the most prestigious French *grandes écoles*, which he matched with other nominative sources. Thereby, he studies the multigenerational social reproduction in admissions to these elite schools over the long run, the differentiated returns to education for the access to the business and political elites according to the graduates' social origin, but also the value of *alumni* networks that connect the political and business elites.



**Antoine FERÉY** research focuses on the design of tax-benefits systems, in particular that of income taxes, capital taxes, social transfers, and unemployment insurance, using both theory and empirics. More specifically, he has worked on the design of the French tax-benefit system using microsimulation techniques, on the impact of people's inattention to taxes on tax policy, on optimal commodity and capital taxes, as well as on the interactions between redistribution and unemployment insurance in an optimal tax-benefit system. Antoine Ferey defended in 2021 his PhD dissertation entitled "Essays on the design of tax-benefits systems" at CREST - Ecole Polytechnique under the supervision of Pierre Boyer and Jean-Baptiste Michau. He is currently employed as an Assistant Professor at the Ludwig Maximilian University of Munich

### **Environmental Markets: Is the Promise Fulfilled?**

It has long been recognized that common-pool resources, if left unmanaged, tend to be inefficiently over-extracted. This “problem of the commons” remains pervasive today as many natural resources around the world deplete at unprecedented rates. Environmental markets are a promising solution. By assigning property rights to resources, incentives for over-extraction can be curtailed and welfare increased through more efficient use. These appealing predictions have led to the adoption of environmental markets for nearly every common-pool resource - from fisheries, forests, water, to the global climate. Nevertheless, the effectiveness of environmental markets is predicated on a number of stylized theoretical assumptions, many of which are violated in practice. Thus, it is an empirical question whether environmental markets will be effective under real-world conditions. In this talk, I will review the empirical literature on the performance of environmental markets, emphasizing identification challenges and solutions. I will conclude with a detailed discussion of my recent paper on groundwater markets (Ayres, A.B., Meng, K.C., and A.J. Plantinga. 2021. Do Environmental Markets Improve on Open Access? Evidence from California Groundwater Rights. *Journal of Political Economy* 129(10):2817-2860).

**Keynote Lecture in Urban Economics**

### **Prime location** (co-authored with Gabriel Ahlfeldt and Thilo Albers)

We harness big data to detect prime locations—large clusters of knowledge-based tradable services in 125 global cities and track changes in the within-city geography of prime service jobs over a century. Prime services are less spatially concentrated and prime locations are farther away from historic cores in historically smaller cities that did not develop early public transit networks. We rationalize these novel stylized facts empirically and theoretically. External returns to scale give rise to multiple equilibria in the city-internal distribution of prime services. The resilience of historic prime locations in historically large cities originates at least partially from endogenous durable transport networks.

**Financial Market Design and Market Power**

In recent years, one of the most salient developments in economic research has been the work on market design motivated by new data and new questions concerning market fragmentation and imperfect competition. Parallel developments have occurred in other markets. New data on market concentration and spatial data on market fragmentation continues to be reported for virtually every sector of the economy, including industries that have traditionally been analyzed using competitive models of markets which are “centralized” in some sense. This talk will review recent advances in the literature on (primarily though not exclusively financial) market design. Special focus will be on the demand for new methods - theoretical and empirical - brought by the need to account for market fragmentation and imperfect competition. The talk will discuss open problems, challenges, and potential insights.

**A balance between art and science: 15 years of unconventional monetary policies**

During the Great Moderation era from the mid-1980s to 2007, both central bankers and academics had grown increasingly confident in the science of monetary policy. The Great Financial Crisis in the late 2000s initiated a reversal in terms of monetary policy design and instruments used. This has opened a period of many innovations, from open-ended liquidity provision and asset purchase programs to negative interest rates and forward guidance. Those innovations have been – at first glance – more inspired by the crafts and know-hows of central bankers than from macroeconomic research. Yet, this broad narrative misses the changing role of research which has been switching from the design of monetary rules to a search for understanding the interactions between finance and macro and how unconventional policy instruments impact macro aggregates

**Gianfranco PIRAS**, Associate Professor, Department of Economics, The Catholic University of America, Washington D.C.

**Past, Present and Future Developments for Spatial Econometrics Models in R**

An overview of the current development and future plans for the econometric analysis of spatial cross sectional data in R will be presented, focusing in particular on three libraries and their applications: `sphet`, `spldv` and `hspm`. `sphet` has been under development for the last 10 years or so and deals with the GMM estimation of spatial cross sectional models. Recently, interesting features have been added such as a full treatment of impacts estimates and inference (Piras and Postiglione, 2021). The second library deals with the estimation of spatial limited dependent variables models (Piras and Sarrias, 2022a; 2022b). In particular, it offers a battery of one and two step GMM estimators for the probit and logit models. Finally, `hspm`, which is only at the initial stage of development, has to do with the development of spatial models with heterogenous coefficients.
